

# CONGRATS! YOU GOT YOUR LICENSE! BUT... **WHAT SHOULD YOU KNOW BEFORE HITTING THE ROAD?**

Did you get your license between the ages of **15 and 18**?

If so, you have an **Intermediate Driver's License** for the **first 270 days**.  
What does that mean?

#### **Restrictions on intermediate licenses:**

- Cannot drive with anyone in the car other than an immediate family member (there are exceptions you can look up)
- Cannot drive between the hours of 12am and 5am
- Cannot use/touch mobile devices, even at a stoplight! You must be parked!

#### **What happens if you break any of those rules?**

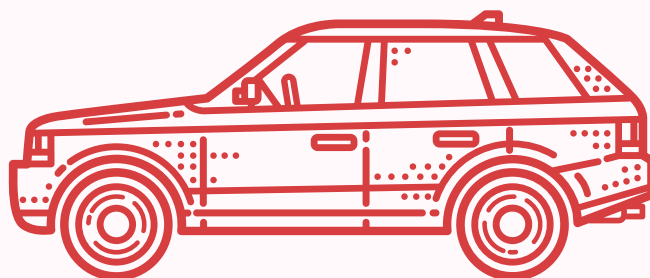
- 1<sup>st</sup> violation: 60 day license suspension and then 270-day clock starts over
- 2<sup>nd</sup> violation: 180 day license suspension and then 270-day clock starts over
- 3<sup>rd</sup> violation (and beyond): 1 year license suspension and then 270-day clock starts over

Did you get your license between the ages of **18 and 20**?

If so, you have an **Juvenile Provisional License** for the first **2 years**.  
What does that mean?

#### **Under your Juvenile Provisional License, there are additional penalties if you are convicted of ANY moving violation:**

- 1<sup>st</sup> conviction: 30-day license suspension
- 2<sup>nd</sup> conviction: 180-day license suspension
- 3<sup>rd</sup> conviction (and beyond): 1-year license suspension



## **Re-Earning Your Driver's Privilege**

#### **If you lose your license, reinstatement may require:**

- Completing the traffic offender program
- Paying a \$200 reinstatement fee
- Road re-examination
- Community service (if required by the court)

AND

- Insurance costs got up
